PROGRAM - Mid-Year Business Meeting: President Marsha presented the slate of 2016-2017 Board Members. They are: Greg Thompson, PE; Marsha, past President; Felix, Kate, Pam, Jackie, Glenn, Randy, Doris, and Karri. The current board is recruiting a President Elect Nominee.

Randy presented the Board's proposal regarding the disbursement of our foundation's CD. There is currently \$37,457.80 in that CD. The proposal is to start distributing these funds through scholarships. For each of the next two years: Allocate \$2000 to a scholarship for a college-bound high school senior; allocate two \$1000 scholarships to North Fork students at DMTC; allocate \$3200 to the North Fork Ambulance Association to train an advanced EMT. After two years, the Board proposes to review the disbursement decision and decide how to proceed from there. Unused funds from the CD will be held in a low-risk, thus low-return fund. Club members discussed the proposal at length then voted unanimously to accept it.
