**ROTARY INTERNATIONAL:** May is youth services month. <u>Rotary Youth Exchange</u> builds peace one young person at a time. Students learn a new language, discover another culture, and truly become global citizens. Exchanges for students 15 to 19 years old are sponsored by Rotary clubs in more than 100 countries.

What are the benefits? Exchange students unlock their true potential to:

**Develop lifelong leadership skills** 

Learn a new language and culture

Build lasting friendships with young people from around the world

Become a global citizen

How long do exchanges last? Long-term exchanges last a full academic year, and students attend local schools and live with multiple host families. Short-term exchanges last from several days to three months and are often structured as camps, tours, or home stays that take place when school is not in session.

What are the costs? Room and board are provided, as well as any school fees. Each program varies, but students are usually responsible for:

**Round-trip** airfare

Travel insurance Travel documents (such as passports and visas) Spending money and any additional travel or tours

Candidates are 15-19 years old and are leaders in their schools and communities. Hosting an exchange student can be incredibly rewarding for your family, bringing an international experience directly into your home. Host families provide room and board and share their lives with exchange students, involving them in family, community, and cultural activities. All host families are screened and trained.
