LAST MEETING: August 4, 2016

ANNOUNCEMENTS: James Schott, PE, gave the BOD meeting report. The club and its foundation have the same BOD, but operate separately. Davis Walton is on a 6 month leave of absence. A committee has been formed to develop an action agenda based on the strategic plan. Schott will have an exit interview with Bill Barton as Barton has recently resigned from the club.

The Ducky Derby on Sept. 10: Having still not found someone to provide food for this event, the BOD decided that we members will provide pulled pork, cole slaw and drinks. Sell tickets!

Alan Wells, a relatively new High Country News employee, was inducted as a new member. He remarked on the generosity of the community, and on its warmth and support from his first day in the valley. He rated us as awesome.

PROGRAM: Betsy Marston introduced Ken Nordstrom, the Environmental Health Director of the County Health Department. His job is to promote and protect public health through the enforcement of regulations. He conducts restaurant inspections, the results of which may be found on the county website. He also inspects septic tanks as well as sanitation at schools and other public facilities. He investigates complaints such as air pollution concerns.

Of primary concern is zoonosis, diseases carried by animals to humans. Some examples: 10% of the bat population carries rabies; prairie dogs, ground squirrels and other rodents can carry fleas which are the vector for plague; one third of the deer mouse population carries hantavirus. West Nile virus has been in Colorado since 1999. There were 101 human cases in 2015, but only 4 so far in 2016. This disease tends to be cyclical. It is endemic in the environment and is transferred from birds to mosquitoes. As for the zika virus, it was first detected in 1947 in a monkey population in Africa. The virus spread to Asia and South America, where infections exploded within the last year. It has now infected people in 51 countries. Colorado has a zika action plan, as there are now 1650 cases in the US. Health advisories go to local doctors so they know to be aware of symptoms of zoonotic diseases. 80% of people who contract

zika don't know they have it, though the virus will show up in blood samples. Our ability to travel the world as easily as we do is the main reason "exotic" diseases spread rapidly.
