PROGRAM: President James introduced District Governor, George Small, and his wife, Sue. Assistant Governor, Sam Kevan was also in attendance. DG George gave the following powerpoint presentation:

<u>The Nuts & Bolts of Rotary</u> - "The RI President for 2017-18 is Ian Riseley from Australia. His theme is 'Rotary – Making a Difference'. I join President Riseley and challenge you to truly make a difference with the award of a Presidential Citation."

Elements of the Presidential Citation

- A) Required activities: "Pay dues on time. Report volunteer hours and service projects and contributions in Rotary Club Central." This is a new element for all clubs. Starting with July 1, 2017, every member should keep track of time spent planning and participating in club service projects.
- B) Support and Strengthen Clubs (complete 4 of 8): 1 Set at least 10 goals; 2 Update or develop strategic plan; 3 Net gain in membership of one; 4 Net gain of female members; 5 Net gain of members under 40; 6 Engagement in outside activities; 7 Start new club or Rotary Community Corp; 8 Sponsor or Co-sponsor an Interact or Rotaract club.
- C) Focus and Increase Humanitarian Service (complete 4 of 9): 1 Sponsor/participate in PolioPlus activity; 2 Get a global or district grant; 3 Conduct one environment focused project; 4 Collaborate with other clubs to increase scope or visibility; 5 Involve Rotary Alumni in projects/events; 6 Increase club giving to The Rotary Foundation by 10%; 7 Increase number of members giving \$25 or more to TRF; 8 Attain a minimum Annual Fund Giving of \$100 per capita; 9 Use "Rotary Ideas" to contribute

a project or seek resources for local or international projects.

D) Enhance Public Image and Awareness (select 4 of 8): 1 - Use "Brand Central" guidelines and templates in all communications; 2 - Regularly update club's website and social media; 3 - Host or promote a community event to support World Polio Day; 4 - Host one network event for professionals; 5 - Establish or continue a partnership with government, corporation or NGO; 6 - Host a community forum highlighting club's work; 7 - Get local media coverage of project, event or fund raiser; 8 - Promote peace and develop future leaders with at least one RYE or RYLA.

"Let's celebrate the presentation of your Presidential Citation on June 30, 2018," said DG George. [Looks like we are well on our way. - ED]

How do we make clubs stronger and sustainable?

- A) Leadership Continuity: President Elect and President Elect Nominee selection and training Why not also have a President Elect Nominee Designate and have all of them attend assemblies, conferences and leadership institutes?
- B) Stronger and Sustainable Clubs: 1 Have leadership continuity, participate in grant training, participate in district committees, and make nominations for district awards. 2 Are aware of the actions of the Council on Legislation that allow for flexibility in meeting frequency and format and membership types. 3 Recognize changing demographics such as age, life style demands and technology.

DG George's challenge

- A) That every club in the district have a social media presence.
- B) That every club communicate with him and other clubs in the district what it is doing in fund raising, service projects, and meeting Presidential citation requirements.
- C) That every club update or develop a strategic plan.
