PROGRAM:

ELAINE BRETT discussed the Heart and Sole Project and other things going on around the area. Joy handed out a survey regarding the Heart and Soul Project. Elaine reflected on Rotary's Four Way Test as often cited around the world as a values statement — a way to live. A community needs a set of shared values an ethic to live by, otherwise it is just a group of people living close together. The **H&S Project collected information from** most everyone over a period of time, distilled it in nine *value* statements that are

included in the survey. The question is, did we get it right? Please fill out the survey and return it by August 15th, and put your name into a drawing for a \$100 gift card. H&S feels like it is reaching many

different demographics.

"Value of diversity" was the most surprising, especially ideology freedom and independence value brought a lot of different ideas.

What are expected outcomes?

*Keep the conversation going about what is important to the community.

*Inform town governments when making decisions.

*Potential \$ resources because of community planning.

*Community improvement.

"By identifying what matters most to the people of the NFV, we weave a tapestry that creates a unified sense of who we are and what enhances our local economy and preserves our quality of life."

BECAUSE OF ELAINE'S interest in Rotary's FOUR WAY TEST, let me give a brief rundown of how this came about. I did have a bulletin many years ago concerning this, but it is time again. And, I just might forward each of you via email the Rotary International's complete story about this.

Seems that in the Great Depression, a U.S. Rotarian devised a simple four-part ethics guideline that helped him rescue a beleaguered business, the near bankrupt Club Aluminum Company of Chicago. The statement of principals it embodied also helped many others find their own ethical compass. Soon embraced and popularized by Rotary **International, The Four Way Test today** stands as one of the organization's hallmarks. It may very well be one of the most famous statements of the century.
