PROGRAM: Paonia Elementary School

Sarah introduced Amelia Baldwin, Principal of Paonia Elementary. She said the school had come to her attention when she heard that it had been awarded the Governors Distinguished Improvement Award as well as the John Irwin School of Excellence Award. She wanted to hear more about the school, and so invited Ms. Baldwin to come speak to the club.

Ms. Baldwin began by thanking Rotary for everything the Club does for the elementary school as well as the other schools in the valley, and for the community as a whole. She gave a brief account of her history in the valley, having attended school in Crawford and Hotchkiss. She attended college at Colorado State and CMU.

She has taught school in California and on the Front Range, and she is amazed at what the Delta School District and the teachers offer students here.

There are 197 students in the school, which offers K-6 grades. Preschool is also offered. Enrollment is growing rapidly. The school is 21% minority and 8% English language learners. 14% of the students are in Special Education programs and 4% are in Gifted and Talented programs. There are 13 certified teachers and 36 staff members. Class size is around 25 to 29 students.



The goal of the school is to grow all of the students individually, and she listed a number of awards the school has received for having done that consistently over the years. These results were attributed to teamwork among the administrators and staff, the parents, the volunteers and community support and involvement. Everyone makes it a point to connect and make an impact with the kids. This is coupled with high expectations of the students who are pushed and challenged at the level that is right for them.

The values the school strives to embody include enthusiasm for teaching and learning, valuing each child, a strong social-emotional foundation, teamwork, independent problem solving, creative self-discovery, a challenging and caring learning environment and community partnerships. These values are actions, not just words.

Funding is a major concern. Out of 178 districts, Delta Schools rank 174 in terms of funding. This was attributed to State funding formulas.

She had a lot more to say about the school and the students, and a robust and informative Q&A session followed.
