## **PROGRAM: North Fork Historical Society Judy Livingston**

Although Kevin originally invited today's speaker, Pam introduced Judy Livingston, longtime President of the North Fork Historical Society.

Ms. Livingston presented a program about the Rockwell Cup, which she described as the most coveted honor for graduating seniors from Paonia High School. The award was created by businessman Brad Emory. In 1913, Mr. Emory sold his clothing business and moved away from Paonia, turning the cup award over to his friends Eileen and Robert Rockwell.

Ms. Livingston then shared a history of the Rockwell family, dating back to 1906 when Robert Rockwell, Sr. moved to the North Fork Valley from New York. Ms. Livingston continued by reading some passages

from a biography Robert Rockwell, Jr. wrote in 2007, recounted his memories starting as a 4-year-old living in Paonia in 1915. An encounter with Richard Nixon, memories of the Paonia Golf Course on Dead Horse Hill and Robert Jr's pet eagle were highlights.

Another section of the biography Ms. Livingston shared concerned her mother and four aunts entitled "The Five Paonia Queens".

The biography also recounted that Robert Jr. was awarded the Rockwell Cup upon graduation in 1929 and then proceeded to attend Whittier College and Stanford in California.

Robert Rockwell, Sr. was a successful cattle rancher, a state senator, and the youngest lieutenant governor of Colorado. He refused to cooperate with the Ku Klux Klan and was therefore defeated in his bid for Colorado governor in 1924. Robert, Sr. was elected to the U.S. Congress in 1941 and represented Western Colorado for the next seven years.

As an aside, Ms. Livingston pointed out the Robert Rockwell, Jr. established one of the finest museums of Western art in the world in Corning, New York.

Robert Rockwell, Sr. was a member of the Paonia Rotary Club and served as President.
